

GRASS ROOTS

Many villagers have contacted the Parish Council recently to complain about the overgrown cemetery and playing field. It has subsequently emerged that problems with a change in sub-contractor have resulted in the cutting of the grass in the village cemetery and playing field falling behind schedule.

The contract for grass mowing is currently held by Nurture Landscapes, a nationwide company, which employs local sub-contractors to carry out the actual work. Normally the grass cutting year starts in April, but due to a mix-up during a change of sub-contractor at the beginning of the year, Bosworth's contract was overlooked. The Parish Council holds a long-term contract with Nurture Landscapes and was generally very pleased with the work that had been carried out over the past two seasons. Being unaware of the change of sub-contractor the Council had anticipated that a similar standard of work would continue in the new season. When it became apparent that something was amiss an urgent site meeting was arranged with representatives of Nurture Landscapes and the new sub-contractors. The problem was put down to a break-down in communication between Nurture and the new field team. The problem has now been resolved as best it can be at present, although it is acknowledged that, due to the excessive amount of overgrowth, it may be some time before the cemetery, in particular, is restored to the condition that we have come to expect. *Special thanks must go to Nigel Brotherton who saved the day by mowing the lower playing field for the Rounders Club pre-season warm-up match.*

FESTIVAL AND OPEN GARDENS

Bosworth Spring Festival and Open Gardens Weekend is on May 31st and Sunday, June 1st, from 11.00am to 5.00pm. Photographs taken by villagers for the 'Life of Bosworth' competition during 2013 will be on display. The Historical Society remembers those men from the village who have given their lives in conflict, in a special exhibition.

Light refreshments will be served throughout the weekend in the church servery.

There will also be eleven lovely gardens around the village open for the the public to explore.

Joint entry to all events will be by programme, available in church for £3 (accompanied children under 16 free) Proceeds in aid of Church Funds.

GARDENING NEWS

Whilst throwing out some old copies of the *Sunday Times*, villager Patricia Hobson spotted a snippet of information relating to Husbands Bosworth allotments. In 1846, plot-holders were warned: "Every occupier is expected to attend divine service on Sundays; and every occupier who digs potatoes or otherwise works his land on Sunday shall immediately forfeit the same".

A copy of the Rules of the Allotments held in the Historical Society's Archive collection also adds: "The land shall only be worked by spade husbandry. Two ordinary loads of manure shall be laid every year upon each rood. Not more than half of any allotment in any one year shall be cropped with white grain; the other half to be cropped with pulse, potatoes or green crops, but no turnips or other crop of that kind to be grown for seed. The corn stubbles shall be dug up every year before Christmas".

CATTHORPE CONCERNS

THE KINGSWOOD EXPERIENCE

The benefits of physical exercise and having the opportunity to play outdoors are well known and documented. So off we went to spend three days having a glorious time getting wet and muddy at the Kingswood Activity Centre in Staffordshire. We left Husbands Bosworth on Wednesday lunchtime and arrived at the centre 90 minutes later. The first task was for the children to make their own beds. After a protracted argument with 21 duvet covers and tricky fitted sheets, we were ready for our first activities. BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection



This month's picture shows the Theddingworth Road approach to the village during work to straighten out the hair-pin corner. The work was carried out in 1963 and was necessary due to the difficulties that were being experienced with the increase in motor traffic, especially lorries, along what was then a main east-west arterial route. The corner was known locally as Mirror Bend - perhaps due to the number of lorry wing-mirrors it claimed! The new road was cut across the footings of the outbuildings to the old rectory that stood on the roadside, and truncated the graveyard, which necessitated the moving of the church gates to Church Street. The

line of the original path to the church can still be made out in the dip in the turf outside the church doors. The line of the road can still be found outside the Hall Lodge, the bulk of the Tarmac surface still lurking beneath the grass verges.

Visitors' Questions

Two allotment holders raised concerns regarding plot boundaries, and in particular permission to work and clear ground outside the defined boundaries. Council acknowledged that although the work in question had been carried out in good faith, they pointed out that the area worked was part of an access way to other plots and as such should be kept clear at all times. Council agreed to meet on site in the near future to assess the situation.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Matters Arising

Nothing had been heard regarding Highways inspection of the state of Broad Lane, which should have been carried out. Clerk was asked to chase this up.

The Community Heartbeat Foundation contact had not been able to attend Council meetings to discuss the technicalities of providing a community defibrillator due to evening training sessions. It was agreed to ask if a day-time meeting would be more convenient.

The problem of overhanging ivy in Green Lane was unresolved. Clerk was asked to contact Highways again and point out that the root-stocks were on Highways land and should be cut back.

Cemetery

Council noted that the grass in the cemetery, playing field and play area had not been cut. Clerk informed Council that the sub-contractors had changed and that the Husbands Bosworth contract had not been passed to the new operators. Problems getting a response to calls to the contract-holders had meant that the grass was now seriously over-grown. A meeting has been arranged to sort the matter out. Payment would be withheld for work not carried out.

Playing Field & Play Area

The state of the grass was discussed. Council noted that Nigel Brotherton had stepped in at the last minute to mow the lower field to enable the Rounders Team to play their opening game of the season. Clerk was asked to thank Mr. Brotherton for helping out.

The poor state of the practice pitch goal posts was discussed. It was agreed to have a site meeting to assess the possibility of restoring the existing posts.

Traffic Issues

The down-loading issues with the Speed Indicator Device had now been resolved, although anomalies were still evident in some of the data.

Rural Broadband

No further information about the roll-out was available. A County Council meeting was scheduled for early June and Mrs. Hobson hoped there would be some progress on the survey work and possible time-scales at this meeting.

Correspondence & Planning

Council discussed the latest developments in the proposed Pebble Hall energy generating scheme. Concerns had been raised about the impact that the development would have on properties in Marston Trussell and Hothorpe and further assessments had been commissioned. Council noted that the problems were complex and that the technical consultations, although desk-based, indicated that the issues raised would be well-within recognised guidelines. Members voiced concerns that, with the two proposed schemes being judged separately, the developers were using 'salami-slicing' tactics to improve the chances of getting permission.

Any Other Business

Clerk was asked to seek expressions of interest for interim cuts of the public grassed areas as the District Council cuts would only be monthly this year. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Tuesday, June 10th at 7.45pm in the Church Hall. (NOTE CHANGE OF DATE & VENUE)

From the Rectory

Foodbanks have been in the news quite a bit just recently. There are a number of them springing up all over the place. There has been one in Market Harborough for some time and since January this year there has been one in Lutterworth. This is an initiative run by the parish church in Lutterworth and supported by the Council and many of the churches around the area. The idea is that people, businesses or individuals, donate food which is then given out to people who might be in crisis. In order to receive help people have to be referred by someone who has been authorised by the Foodbank to make referrals. This includes a variety of different professional people and here in Husbands Bosworth includes me.

So should you find yourself in a time of crisis, with no food or means to get some then it is worth knocking on my door. The Lutterworth Foodbank issue up to three days of food for each person in the household in any one emergency, the hope being that within those three days the crisis will be resolved. They will also point people in the direction of other services that can help them. One way of supporting this work is to give food to the foodbank, and for any who would like to contribute in this way there will be a collection box at church. They are not able to use fresh, frozen, out of date or damaged items, but will happily receive tinned foods, biscuits, packet or dried foods, UHT milk and long life juices, jams, toiletries etc. The gifts will be passed on to the Foodbank on a monthly basis and stored in their warehouse until needed. It is sad that in this day and age such a service is necessary, but as it is, let's do what we can to support it. *Liz*
