

CANAL BASE PLANS RESURFACE...

Proposals for a 240-berth canal base between Husbands Bosworth and North Kilworth, originally tabled in February last year, have recently resurfaced.

Last year plans submitted for a boat repair and boat building yard, retail units and a canal-side pub met considerable local opposition and were withdrawn after highways authority officers voiced concerns about increased traffic movements likely to be generated by the operations planned for the site.

Planners were also worried about the pedestrian and cycle access and had reservations about the public house and the other retail aspects of the proposals, feeling that these would constitute over-development of the site and be out of character in the rural setting. The new proposals, promoted by Mike Goode, who operates a canal marina and boat yard complex at Debdale Wharf near Smeeton Westerby, omit the retail units and the public house from the original plans and therefore reduce the projected traffic movements. Additional signing, speed reduction measures and road marking on the A4304 Station Road are also proposed to improve road safety.

The revised plans still include boat servicing, repair and maintenance facilities and a boat brokerage and hire base, which opponents of the proposals say will jeopardise the viability of operations at the established business nearby at Kilworth Wharf.

The proposals involve the realignment of a stream, which at this point marks the historic parish and deanery boundaries and the creation of three inter-linked lagoons which will form the mooring sites. A new access from the canal towing path into the complex would be created and a pedestrian footbridge installed.

Public access to the 10 hectare (24 acre) site, which was envisaged in the original plans as a feature has now been deleted and access, away from the workshop areas, would be restricted to moorers.

Opposition to the plans focuses on the traffic issues and that the development would be out of character in the rural setting.

There will be a special meeting, called by North Kilworth Parish Council to discuss this proposal on Thursday, February 3rd at 7.30 in the Belgrave Memorial Hall, North Kilworth.

WASTE BAND...

Approximately 45 tonnes of food waste was collected by Harborough's waste team in the first week of January this year - nearly twice as much as is collected during an average week in the district.

More than 1,000 tonnes of food waste has been collected since the scheme began last May. Harborough has the best recycling rate in Leicestershire and is 15th best in the country out of 358 local authority areas. The aim is to use food waste collection to break into the top ten recyclers countrywide for the first time.

All food waste collected in the kerbside collection scheme is heat-treated and recycled as agricultural compost.

LOCAL CRIME FILE

- Burglary to an unalarmed dwelling in Catthorpe. Entry was gained by smashing a window and high value property was stolen.
- An Ipod and a tool kit left on display inside a car parked unattended outside a dwelling in Swinford was stolen.
- Before Christmas three incidences of sheep rustling were reported in the north of Harborough district near Billesdon and Scraftoft. In one incident a cattle trailer was also stolen, which police assume was used to transport the stolen sheep.
- Reports of number plates stolen from vehicles parked in Husbands Bosworth.

The post of Community Liaison Officer at Market Harborough Police has been lost in the present round of cost cutting. Henry Whately, who held this post throughout its 8 years in operation built up a strong relationship with local communities and was always a highly regarded source of advice and information on local crime issues. It is hoped that the messaging service that Henry used to pass information out to the community will be carried on in some form and that we can keep our readers informed about current criminal activity and policing issues.

The old e-mail scam purporting to be from Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs and suggesting that a tax refund may be due is again doing the rounds. This scam is a malicious attempt to gain personal information with a view to committing fraud. The advice on the HMRC's own website is that they would not inform customers of a tax rebate via e-mail. Report of the Parish Council Open Meeting held on Tuesday, December 7th, 2010.

Present: Five Council members. No members of the public. Apologies were received from Sue Fisher and District Councillor Brian Smith.

Matters arising from the Minutes

■ Council heard that residents of Butt Lane had obtained quotes for a heated mirror to replace the 'fogged' mirror opposite Butt Lane entrance.

Cemetery

■ One quote had been received for installing a soakaway system for the cemetery extension. Further quotes would be obtained.

Allotments

■ Council agreed to review the Lettings Agreement at the next meeting in time for the letting period, which commences on March 25th.

Traffic Issues

■ Funding for the Speed Activated Sign is in place and the sites have been authorised by LCC Highways. The 'go-ahead' would be given after a Letter of Understanding had been forwarded to LCC regarding the installation and operation of the device.

■ Council briefly discussed the provision of grit bins. A suitable site had been found to install the Butt Lane / Lammas Close bin.

■ Councillors noted that the modifications that they had advised to the part-night lighting scheme had been incorporated in to the revised plan.

Accounts

■ Council approved the accounts as presented.

■ Members ratified the parish precept for 2011/2012.

Any other business

■ Mr. Forman thanked council members for their help and enthusiasm at the recent Air Crash Memorial Dedication ceremony.

■ Council approved the payment for the improvements to the sports pavilion pathways. Funds for this were to be released by the Playing Field Committee.

■ Concerns were raised that vehicles are still being driven onto the grass verges opposite the surgery despite signs warning drivers that bulbs have been planted. It was agreed that the Clerk should write to the surgery practice manager and ask that delivery vehicles should avoid parking on the grass verge. Clerk to consult with Highways regarding the installation of bollards.

■ Broken and dangerous road surfaces were noted in lower Bell Lane. Clerk was asked to bring this to the attention of Highways.

■ PCSO Ray Wells discussed local criminal activity. He was aware of the possibility of some small scale drug dealing, which was being investigated. Police are aware of some minor crimes locally that weren't being reported and urged everyone to report all crimes, no matter how trivial or petty, as the police couldn't assess the level of crime or act on information if that information wasn't being presented. He also noted that a high proportion of thefts from vehicles were from vehicles that were probably secured but where valuable items were left in full view.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be the Annual General Meeting on Tuesday, February 1st at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.
