

CANAL PLAN HOLDS WATER

Plans for a new canal marina on agricultural land between North Kilworth and Husbands Bosworth have been given the go-ahead by Harborough planners despite vociferous local opposition.

The parish councils of both North Kilworth and Husbands Bosworth voiced their concerns about the extra traffic that will be generated by the operations planned for the site and the road safety aspects on a particularly fast stretch of the A4304. Villagers felt that the development was too big and out of character for the area and lacked any contribution to the local communities.

Planning committee members noted the county Highways Authority's recommendation that the application be refused on road safety grounds but felt that the likely advantages to local tourism and the benefit to the local economy outweighed the perceived risk to road users. The project will provide 240 mooring spaces, boat building, servicing and maintenance facilities and a chandlery on the 26 acre site. Earlier proposals to include a canal-side public house and retail units have been shelved by the promoters for the time being.

STOP PRESS: This application has now been referred to the full Council for determination.

SPIRITUAL NEEDS

Like many community facilities, our parish church only functions because of the input of a small band of volunteers. Maybe as we progress in the period of interregnum, under the guidance of our Curate, Rev. Andy Rhoades, we should take the opportunity to reflect on the efforts of those who keep the ship afloat.

The church doesn't run itself and without the dedication of these few, not only the fabric of the building and its surroundings but also its ministry, would be in peril.

With such a small group of regular helpers the addition of one or two new faces could make a significant contribution. So if you have a desire to see that the church remains upright and that the community's spiritual needs are fulfilled have a word with the churchwardens, Brian Smith or Lorrie Forman or the Curate, Reverend Andy.

If you would like to help but don't want to commit yourself you can do so by simply supporting the church activities throughout the year, or by contributing towards the ever-increasing funds needed.

LANDFILL PLANS

Leicestershire County Council has recently released proposals for the siting of waste management facilities through to 2025. Husbands Bosworth Quarry, adjacent to the A5199 south of the village, is already licenced to receive inert landfill waste until 2015. The new proposals, tabled by operators Lafarge Aggregates Ltd., seek to extend this permission until 2025 at an estimated rate of 100,000 tonnes a year.

The proposals are at a draft stage at present and further assessments of the suitability of the site, the likely impact of traffic generated by the operations, the effect on the local community and the visual impact of restoration after closure will need to be undertaken before the plan is adopted.

At a quarry liaison meeting between representatives of the local communities and Lafarge held in October it was noted that material coming to the site had reduced due to the downturn in the building trade, and recycling and alternative uses for the waste. The existing end-date of 2015 for completion of the landfill phase was unlikely to be met.

COUNTING BOSWORTH

Every ten years the Office of National Statistics (ONS) carries out a census of the population. The next full census will take place on Sunday, March 27th 2011, when ONS will send out census forms to all 25 million addresses in England and Wales. Census information is used by government and local agencies and commercial bodies to produce budgets for future expenditure and plan service provision. It is important that the census is full and accurate as small discrepancies could have an impact on the country's future planning. It is a legal requirement that every household completes a census return and every occupant on the evening of March 27th, whether a permanent member of the household or a visitor, must be included. VILLAGE ROAD CLOSURES

The county Highways Authority is warning motorists of possible delays whilst major road works and resurfacing is carried out in the village over the next few weeks. The works, which will involve the partial closure of the A5199 Bell Lane and Berridges Lane through the village, will commence on Tuesday, March 1st. It is expected that the work will be completed within two weeks. During the work parts of Berridges Lane and Bell Lane, above and below the junction with Hillcrest Lane, will be closed in sequence and the one-way orders on both roads will be temporarily removed allowing two-way traffic on these sections to allow access. Access to properties will be maintained at all times but temporary local diversions may be in place. Through traffic will be directed along Kilworth Road, Pincet Lane and Leicester Road and vice versa, and will be clearly signposted.

NEW PARKING RULES

Pedestrians, wheelchair users and cyclists are set to benefit from new parking rules designed to increase safety. New rules mean that motorists who obstruct dropped kerbs, park inconsiderately or double-park could receive a fine.

The move is designed to keep traffic moving, cut congestion and make sure streets are accessible to emergency vehicles. Vehicles parked alongside dropped kerbs can also obstruct pushchairs, wheelchairs and mobility scooters and prevent pedestrians crossing at a safe place.

From March 1st fixed £70 penalty charge notices will be issued to drivers who contravene the new regulations. Tickets will also be issued by post where they are prevented from physically affixing them to the vehicle.

Penalty charge notices may also be issued to motorists blocking access to properties, but this will only be at the request of the occupier and subject to an observation by an enforcing officer.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

The Historical Society's Periodical Journal

From the Historical Society Archive

Extract from Churchwarden's Account Book January 25th, 1782

"Memorandum this day between the Churchwardens and David Hatfield, Clockmaker, viz. that for the sum of Two Pounds, Five Shillings, the said David Hatfield is to put into Good & Substantial Repair the Church or Parish Clock, and after the said repairs shall keep in thorough good repair the said Clock for the sum of Six Shillings by the year for the next 20 years."

Would any craftsman today commit to a 20 year contract at a fixed rate? Hatfield seems to have been reasonably happy with the arrangement though. In the Account Book entry for March 25th 1804 (2 years over his contract!) he renewed the agreement for a further 7 years at the revised price of 10 shillings a year!

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Report of the Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday, February 1st 2011.

Five Council members, District Councillor Brian Smith, County Councillor Graham Hart and 8 members of the public were present.

Visitors' Questions

■The proprietors of Kilworth Marina and local boaters addressed the meeting regarding the proposed development adjacent to the canal at North Kilworth. They queried points within the proposals, especially the likelihood of little local gain from the businesses planned for the site. Council noted that the hastily added pedestrian access conflicted with the security of the site. District Councillor Smith was in receipt of the HDC Planning Report which recommended refusal, mainly on traffic safety issues.

■Matters referring to the traffic mirror for Butt Lane were discussed briefly. This matter to be progressed by residents themselves. Council reiterated that it had set aside funding to part-fund traffic safety measures for Butt Lane.

■The removal of the canal towpath bridge at Welford Marina was discussed. Council understood that the responsibility for the bridge fell to the marina operators who had removed the bridge when it became unsafe and declined to reinstate it. Council noted that this was a permissive path and not a public right of way but agreed to raise the matter with British Waterways.

Matters arising from the Minutes of the Previous Meeting

■Members queried the delay in approving the installation of the village speed indicator device. Mr. Forman agreed to chase this up.

■Council noted that vehicles had continued to damage the grass verge outside the Scout Hut entrance. It was agreed to seek information about temporary bollards.

■The poor condition of the road surface in Bell Lane was discussed. It was noted that Highways had marked up the underground utilities in readiness for resurfacing.

Playing Field
