

QUESTIONNAIRE UPDATE

Initial reports suggest that the response to the Neighbourhood Plan Questionnaire has been extremely positive. As this issue of the *Bugle* goes to press it looks as if at least 300 paper returns and 200 on-line returns have been received.

In all, a total of around 850 copies were distributed to about 480 households across the parish. So, the return represents a significant proportion of the population of the parish and the results should therefore show a fair indication of the thoughts and aspirations of the community.

Our Neighbourhood Plan, once drafted and accepted, will be an important legal document - the 'blueprint' for the community's future development, which be must consulted whenever important decisions within the parish are to be made. It will draw a new building line around the village core and protect aspects of the community that we have shown we would like preserved and direct development to areas that we have shown we favour.

The Questionnaire is an important part of the community's 'hands-on' involvement in the Plan's creation. The Advisory Committee would like to take this opportunity to thank the 32 stalwart villagers who undertook to distribute and collect the questionnaire, and especially to thank everyone who filled in the form and participated. QUIZZICAL OUTCOME

Another lively contest saw fifteen village groups battle for the honour of lifting the coveted trophy in the Annual Village Hall Quiz in February.

A fine and fair competition, competently led by last year's winning team, 'The Village Idiots', eventually weeded out the village wheat from the village chaff to provide a worthy winner. After a long and fierce contest, which saw the lead traded briskly in the latter stages, quiz stalwarts and past masters, 'The Strife of Brian' finally conceded the title to 'Let's Get Quizzical' by a mere four points. The honour of hosting next year's quiz now passes to the winning team. In the interests of fairness the *Bugle* notes that 'We Eat Porkpies' and 'Beyond the Fringe' gamely propped up the lower end of the competition!

LEAD THEFTS

Look out there's a bunch of thieves about - again... Yep, the lead thieves are back in operation in our area.

Close to home, Theddingworth was visited for the third time and more lead removed. Churches at Ashby Magna and Peatling Parva have been attacked recently, and now we hear that St. Peter's parish church at Arnesby, has also been the focus of this unwelcome attention.

Our own All Saints church was targeted in November 2015 when lead was stolen from the north aisle roof, resulting in a mammoth fundraising effort to raise the £20,000 for replacement.

With the thieves back in business locally, we need to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity to the police, especially anyone taking particular interest in the church.

CALLING FOUL

Following on from our 'blitz' on dog-fouling in the February *Bugle* we now hear of a scheme set up by villagers in a Cambridgeshire village to try to tackle the problem on their doorstep. In a novel approach to the problem, the residents of Wimblington have come up with a "poo-shaming" social media map, dubbed 'Doodoowatch', in a bid to stamp out the menace.

The scheme allows locals to plot dog fouling hot-spots on an interactive map, which is posted on-line. As well as highlighting problem areas, users can also upload photos of particularly offensive deposits to add emphasis to their gripes. It is hoped that the scheme will 'shame' socially irresponsible dog walkers into changing their habits and encourage them to pick up after their pets. The map will also highlight areas where villagers can avoid the menace and where it is safer to walk.

The scheme coordinators plan to monitor the scheme to see if the public posts result in fewer dog poop incidents in the village.

Fouling follow-up... in the wake of the storm of comments in the February *Bugle* and a poster campaign by a village 'activist', the problem seemed to ease. Recently however, incidents, especially overnight deposits, have started to creep back...

WELFORD ACTION GROUP NEWS

At the recent meeting members noted concerns that the Truck Stop service area at Portly Ford may inadvertently be encouraging HGV traffic to use the A5199.

The group continues to chase the operators of Magna Park and Bruntingthorpe with regard to routing procedures for HGV traffic. It was noted that any new Magna Park developments would be likely to include detailed and enforceable traffic management plans. WAG has requested permission to join Magna Park Community Liaison Group in order to further press their case on local HGV movements.

The on-going works to up-grade the M1 to 'smart motorway' status were causing overnight traffic problems along the A5199, much of which stemmed from poor signing and advance notices. WAG were liaising with Highways England on a regular basis in regard to this matter.

Welford Action Group (WAG) meets regularly to discuss concerns relating to local traffic matters along the A5199 corridor. Husbands Bosworth is represented on the group.

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

A TASTE OF BOSWORTH

Rhubarb Brown Betty

An old fashioned pudding using rhubarb that can be enjoyed by all the family.

Serve with whipped cream.

4-6 Servings

Ingredients

150g plus 1 tablespoon butter, melted

100g fresh brown breadcrumbs

150g crushed digestive biscuits

100g soft brown sugar

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg

Grated zest of 1 lemon

Grated zest of 1 orange

600g cooked rhubarb (Cut into pieces, scatter with sugar and splash of water and simmer gently for approx 8-10 minutes until soft)

100g sultanas or raisins

Method

Preheat oven to 190°C, Gas Mark 5. Using the tablespoon of melted butter, generously grease a medium sized oven-proof dish. Set aside.

In a large bowl, combine the breadcrumbs, digestive biscuits, sugar, spices, lemon and orange zest and remaining melted butter.

Place a third of the mixture on the bottom of the prepared dish, smoothing it down with the back of the spoon. Cover with half the rhubarb and sprinkle over half of the sultanas or raisins. Continue making layers until all ingredients are used, finishing with a layer of crumb mixture. Place dish in oven and bake for 30 mins or until top is golden. Remove from oven and serve straight away.

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Wild Garlic or Ramsons - *Allium Ursinum*

Take a walk through Brickfield Spinney and you'll discover swathes of wild garlic growing towards the eastern edge of the wood. Its spear-shaped leaves form a vivid green carpet which flourishes until the upper canopy of leaves arrives. From April to June it sprouts sparkling white inflorescences, which provide a welcome food source for pollinators.

The presence of wild garlic indicates the woodland has been around for a long time. Our spinney is on a map from the 1880s and was probably established woodland long before then.

Wild garlic is edible and, though it has a similar smell to everyday garlic, it has a mellower, sweeter flavour. The leaves, bulbs and flowers all have culinary uses. The leaves, which are best harvested before the flowers appear,

can be blitzed with walnuts, olive oil and Parmesan to make a delicious pesto.

Here's a recipe for a tasty spring soup: Fry an onion until translucent and add a finely chopped potato. After 5 minutes, add a bay leaf and 500ml of vegetable or chicken stock. Simmer for about 10 minutes, until the potato is cooked. Add a bunch of wild garlic leaves and cook for NO MORE than two minutes. Remove the bay leaf, season, blitz and enjoy. The florets of wild garlic; the white umbels, can be used as an attractive garlicky garnish to a salad and savoury dishes.

This has been more of a cookery article than a piece on wildlife. Perhaps because the bulbs are a much-loved food of wild boar and bears, and neither of these have been seen in the spinney recently. However, it explains the scientific name, *Allium Ursinum*, which is 'Bear Leek'.

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

How well do you know Husbands Bosworth? Do you know where this topiary hedge is to be found? More to the point, do you know what it depicts?

Many drivers and passers by will no doubt have casually noted the smartly trimmed box hedge that borders Berridges Lane. But, how many have looked more closely and spotted the railway locomotive, that trundles down the road?

The hedge and its 'engineering' is the inspiration of Eddie Stover of Hillcrest Lane, who, having inherited the hedge when he and June moved to the village in the early 1980s, decided to add some extra interest to the feature.

The engine is styled on a classic Southern Region Merchant Navy Class loco, with its distinctive smoke deflectors, and completes a train of tender and four carriages. The added joke is that the train is actually travelling the wrong way down Berridges! At one time the one-way sign, at night, illuminated the firebox.

The Southern loco, stylish for its time, is far from its home territory; the rails that swept through Bosworth on their way from Rugby to Market Harborough, carried more workaday LNWR engines, and finally shut up shop in 1966, victim of Dr. Beeching's economic scalpel.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved

Matters Arising

■Members were disappointed at the response of CRT regarding our offer of towpath adoption. (It was noted that a meeting has now been arranged)

■Chairman agreed to follow up the possibility of a site meeting with interested parties regarding the retention of the second access to the Davidson's development.

Neighbourhood Plan

■The Clerk to the NP Advisory Committee and Mr Forman gave an update on the progress of the project.

Cemetery

■Council review of Cemetery Charges would come into force on April 1st. The revised charges would be published on the council website.

Playing Field/Play Area

■No outstanding actions noted.

Allotments

■Council undertook a review of charges. It was noted that costs were being covered and it was agreed to leave the charges unchanged. A review would be carried out in March 2019.

■Council noted that three vacant plots were available for rent for the coming season.

Traffic Issues

■Council noted the recent overnight HGV traffic problems, which appeared to be related to the over-head gantry work associated with the 'smart motorway' upgrade of the M1.

■Council discussed the work being carried out by Welford Action Group on this matter.
