HOUTMAN Peter *Labour* NUNN Amanda *Conservative* RUHL Katherine *Green Party* WOOD John *Liberal Democrats* 



Action Fraud UK has received a number of reports recently of scammers targeting WhatsApp users.

The scam begins when a criminal accesses

a third party WhatsApp account that has you listed as a contact. Posing as a friend or a member of a WhatsApp group that you are in, the scammer will try and start a normal chatty conversation with you. At this point, because the criminal has been trying to log in to your account using your mobile number you will receive a genuine alert message from WhatsApp with a six-digit code to enable you to verify the log in. The criminal will then message you, claiming that you received their code by accident and ask you to forward it to them. Once the criminal has this code, they can access to your WhatsApp account and lock you out and 'harvest' your contacts for fraudulent purposes.

### What you need to do:

¤ Set up two-step verification to give an extra layer of protection to your account:

*Tap Settings > Account > Two-step verification > Enable* 

**THINK** If anyone makes an unusual request on WhatsApp call the person directly to confirm their identity

max Never share your activation code (the 6 digit code you receive via SMS)

Note: It you identify a scam message or any unwanted activity on your account you can use the WhatsApp reporting and blocking facility. Press and hold on the message bubble, select 'Report' and then follow the instructions.

### WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

### European badger - Meles meles

I have never spotted a badger around Bosworth. However, I have captured them on a wildlife camera and we have all witnessed their sad bodies littering local roads...

Their diet is predominantly carnivorous, consisting of earthworms, insects, carrion, small mammals, and the eggs and young of ground-nesting birds. Their meaty diet is



supplemented with a variety of vegetable foods: cereals, tubers, etc.

They typically weigh between 7-13kg in the spring, rising over summer and autumn to 15-17kg as they gain weight for the lean winter months. They don't hibernate but instead, they enter a quiet state, spending much time sleeping and on warm winter days, they may leave the sett to scavenge for food and perform housekeeping duties.

They are fossorial animals, living mostly underground. Their setts are remarkable creations, and clans occupy the same territory for generations, in one recorded case, for over a century. They are meticulous housekeepers, and when defecating they use purpose-built latrine pits which are located away from their burrows. In addition to multiple entry and exit points, spaces in the setts are designated as dormitories and nurseries, where litters of up to five cubs are born in the spring. Here they spend around twelve weeks being tended to before taking their first tentative steps into the world above ground.

Characteristically, boars are heavier than the sows with broader heads and thicker necks, while the sows are sleeker with, for some unfathomable evolutionary purpose, longer, fluffier tails. Concerning bovine tuberculosis, there are strong conflicting arguments for and against badger culls. It is hard for the general public to determine the truth of the situation as Defra claims the culling of 200,000 badgers has helped slow the spread of bovine TB and conservationist experts hold the opposing view.

### **BOSWORTH SKY AT NIGHT**

### Astronomy from your Backyard

The earliest we usually get a dark sky at this time of year is about 10.30pm, so this month we are looking at the Moon and some bright planets. *Moon phases: Full Moon - 5th; Last Quarter - 12th; New Moon - 19th; First Quarter - 27th* 

The first Full Moon in May is known as the Flower Moon. The alignment of the Moon in its orbit around the Earth results in a penumbral lunar eclipse, but unfortunately not for us - our next visible lunar eclipse is on October 28<sup>th</sup>. The New Moon on May 19<sup>th</sup> is a 'Black Moon', it being the third New Moon in a season with four New Moons. Sounds like someone's made that one up just for something to do!

On the night of May 22<sup>nd</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> the new crescent Moon passes between the planets Venus and Mars in the western evening sky, producing an eye-catching formation as the Moon glides between the reddish Mars to the left of the Moon and bright white Venus, below, as shown in the diagram. It's a great display of celestial mechanics as the Moon's motion in space is illustrated by its changing position in our sky. You will also catch sight of two bright stars beside the Moon, *Castor* and *Pollux*, the lead stars of the constellation Gemini.

See if you can spot the 'Earthshine' effect on the darkened face of the new Moon. Whilst the very bright crescent part of the Moon is lit directly by the Sun, the dimly lit part is lit by sunlight reflected back onto the Moon from the Earth. Imagine stepping across the terminator line on the moon, going from glaring sunshine into dusk where the only light is that reflected from the Earth!

### **BYGONE BOSWORTH**

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection


On a recent mapping wander into a neighbouring parish using the 1890 *Ordnance Survey* map we came across this interesting feature. Overlooking the Grand Union Canal and the site of the depopulated Medieval village of Downtown, from the high ground off the South Kilworth road, there once stood this mysterious group of trees.

The field is within the Stanford Estate, and the elevation of the site gives a clear line of sight to Stanford Hall itself. It is suggested that the stand of trees was planted as a memorial relating to the Catholicism of Alfred Verney-Cave, 5<sup>th</sup> Lord Braye of Stanford Hall - if true, this gesture, by any measure, would be quite a show of his lordship's piety... So, what is the significance of the date '1883'?

A trawl of the *British Newspaper Archive* reveals that Lord Braye, who inherited the estate on the death of his mother in 1879, had, for some time, been campaigning vigorously for equal entry opportunities into Oxford and Cambridge universities for Catholics. In July 1883 he bolstered his campaign by hosting a visit to Stanford by the Primate of All England, Cardinal Newman. Later, in December 1883, he reinforced his mission by travelling to the Vatican and securing an audience with the Holy See.

Although the redrafted Universities Tests Act of 1871 had removed all obstacles to college entry, a reluctance, on the part of Cambridge and Oxford in particular, to relax their authority and a reticence within the Catholic community to enter an environment controlled by the Church of England, resulted in a stalemate of obstinacy.

Lord Braye's mission, however, proved fruitful, and helped to persuade the Vatican to promote the founding of Catholic colleges, notably St. Edmunds at Cambridge and, later, Fisher at Oxford. So, were Braye's pious endeavours worth etching a quarter of a mile wide arboreal monument on the landscape?

# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

# Report of the Ordinary meeting of Husbands Bosworth Parish Council held on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> April 2023 at Husbands Bosworth Sports Pavilion

Present: 5 Councillors and 2 members of the public. Apology was received and accepted from Councillor O'Connor.

### **Minutes**

■The minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed as correct

### **Matters Arising**

- ■Clerk confirmed that he had written to the Leader of LCC in relation to LCC supplying timings for the commencement of the clear up work on Firs Farm. A response was received from the Commissioning Manager Estates advising that LCC would be more proactive in keeping the Parish Council informed of the timings when confirmed with the external contractor.
- ■It was also noted that the fence between Firs Farm and the allotments was in a poor state of repair with a real danger of the horses, currently occupying Firs Farm illegally, being able to access the allotments. Clerk to contact LCC requesting that the fence be repaired
- ■Council noted that increasing the Clerk's daily banking payment limit was again not possible due to technical complexities. Clerk was asked to try the online process again
- ■Clerk confirmed that he was awaiting costs and replacement options for the Speed Indicator Device
- ■Clerk advised that he was still waiting for a response from HDC regarding the siting of a waste bin on the High Street.
- ■Clerk advised that the lighting issues on Berridges Lane were in hand by LCC but were complex and would require a road closure

■March 2023 Bank Statements, Cashbook Account Reconciliation and Bank Reconciliation were presented for noting

### **Planning Overview**

■The March 2023 planning application summary was presented and agreed

### **Pavilion Alterations - Update**

■Work is now expected to commence at the end of April or early May, with breakthrough, when hiring of the main room would become problematic, estimated to take place in June

### Picnic in the Park

■It was confirmed that Council will cover the insurance liability for the event. Public liability would be required of all commercial operations on site. Whilst St Mary's Catholic Church will be open to visitors, this will not be part of the official event

### Gigaclear

■Clerk confirmed that Gigaclear had followed up complaints regarding their recent cabling operations and would continue to liaise with the Clerk regarding any problems with ongoing works

### **Primary School Coronation Gift**

After reviewing options and considering any potential safety implications, it was agreed to order the coronation bookmarks with the King Charles III cypher detailed

### **Any Other Business**

- ■Council noted that the ditch between the Bowbridge Homes Estate and the Playing field is overgrown. The ditch on the cemetery side is also blocked and the hedge has been damaged. Clerk was asked to contact Bowbridge management to voice concerns about these matters
- ■Council authorised the immediate clearance on safety grounds, of vegetation around lamp post No 3 on Kilworth Road, which is obscuring the street lighting

### **Easter - Gods International Rescue**

When my boys were little, I used to love watching 'Thunderbirds' on TV with them. The central characters were a rich family, who lived on a secret island, and who spent all their time and money



helping people who were in danger. Whenever they heard that someone was in danger, they would race to the rescue. If a bridge was about to collapse, or a plane about to crash, or a volcano about to erupt, they would race to the scene in their amazing machines and save people.

They had rockets that could fly into space, massive planes that could carry other machines inside them, machines that could tunnel into the earth and aeroplanes that could fly underwater. So exciting!

Their secret organisation was called 'International Rescue' and their logo was a hand reaching out to save the world.

Does it remind you of anybody? A hand outstretched to save the world? Then it struck me - Easter is God's international rescue mission!

We read in the Bible; "The Son of Man came to seek and to save those who were lost." Luke 19:10 As human beings we were lost. We didn't know who God was, we weren't even sure if there was a God, and we certainly didn't know if God loved us or not.

We didn't know that the bad, selfish, and unkind things that we have done have separated us from Father God and we couldn't find our way back home to him. We were lost and alone. So Jesus comes on an international rescue mission.

He tells us how much God loves us and demonstrates Gods love and power by healing people who were sick, even raising the dead to life.

Finally, Jesus dies on the cross, for us. So that we can be forgiven. So that we can be part of God's family again.

Then, on Easter Sunday, the most amazing thing happens! Jesus comes back to life. To show us that now not even death can hurt us when we are part of God's family. An amazing international rescue mission...
