

WATERWAY WORKS

Pedestrians and local dog walkers will be pleased to note that work to improve the towpath from Honeypot Bridge to the tunnel entrance finally seems to be gaining momentum.

The work, which started back in May, has been delayed by unexpected engineering problems, logistical hitches and subsequently by additional assessments and surveys. Much of the length is underlaid by a strata of limestone shale, which has limited the contractor's ability to drive deep piling. Consequently, a scheme of shallow piling and sand-bagged reinforcing has been devised.

Thankfully, the work has already seen the removal of the temporary bridge and unsafe wooden walkway over the worst of the pathway, previously washed out by the cascades down the cutting sides.

It is hoped that the work will extend to repairing the whole of the length and topping off the surface ready for what the winter can throw at it!

Unfortunately, the contractors have confirmed that there are no immediate plans to continue the work further along towards the pipe bridge, where escapee cattle broke down the towpath in the spring, which has resulted in the closure, for safety reasons, of the towpath in that direction for much of the summer.

The Parish Council has for a while, been pursuing the possibility of setting up a Towpath Adoption Scheme over the length of towpath between Honeypot Bridge and the tunnel portal. Once the present restoration work is completed, and a level surface is established, it would be possible for local volunteer groups to maintain.

WASTE BANDS

Recent legislation, announced under the government's Simpler Recycling reforms, required all Councils in England to introduce weekly food waste recycling collections in 2026. Collecting food waste separately can generate cheap and clean energy, turn waste products into fertiliser, cut greenhouse gas emissions, boost recycling and reduce disposal costs. It will also serve as a visual reminder of how much food we throw away and how we can all save money by reducing waste.

When will the service start?

Originally planned for roll-out across Harborough in early 2026, problems sourcing suitable handling facilities and aligning with current waste contracts has meant that Harborough won't now start the service until April 2027. Food waste will be collected separately in a designated food kerb-side waste caddy, every week, in addition to existing recycling and rubbish collections. Every household will receive a 7-litre caddy for indoor use and a 23-litre caddy for presentation on the kerbside each week. Information about the new service will be announced before the service commences, and an initial supply of biodegradable bin-liners will be supplied.

BUGLE POSTBAG

From Action Fraud UK

Recent data from *Report Fraud* reveals that criminals stole £93.8 million through fraud by abuse of position during the 2025/26 financial year. This type of fraud occurs when someone exploits a position of responsibility, authority, or trust to access and steal a victim's money, assets or property without lawful authority. Offenders are often family members, friends, carers, employees, or individuals entrusted to manage another person's finances or affairs.

Many cases involved family members or close friends abusing their position to gain access to a victim's finances, often by stealing bank cards, obtaining banking details or making unauthorised transfers from victim's accounts.

The findings highlight how offenders can target people during periods of vulnerability, including ill health, cognitive decline and bereavement.

We are encouraging organisations and members of the public to share the following guidance with patients, service users, and their family members:

Review financial statements:

Check financial statements regularly for any unauthorised transactions.

Be alert to unpaid bills, missing possessions, or unexpected changes to legal documents or bank accounts

What to do if you are a victim of fraud by abuse of position:

Act quickly if something feels wrong

Tell your bank or card provider if you notice any financial transactions made without lawful authority

BOSWORTH IN FOCUS

WILD ABOUT BOSWORTH

Rose-ringed parakeet or ringneck parrot

Coming to a tree (or bird feeder) near you! Commonly known as the ring-necked parakeet, this invasive bird species was probably introduced into the UK from India or Africa as early as the mid-1800s as an ornamental aviary bird. Early strays from captivity rarely survived the UK winters and natural predation, and for many years the population spread was restricted to suburban areas of London and the Home Counties.

However, in recent years they seem to have adapted to the changing climate and gained a foothold over an increasing area. The RSPB has noted sightings in most English and Welsh counties, with resident populations in most major cities, and a guess of the present population suggests at least 32,000 individuals in the UK, with around 12,600 breeding pairs. Vast flocks of several thousand have been noted, and night-time roost counts have recorded over 1000 birds at a time at some locations in London. During daytime these roost flocks tend to stay together, possibly for self-protection, and will descend on urban gardens and strip fruit trees and soft fruit bushes in a matter of minutes... and overwhelm garden bird feeders!

Concerns have been raised by conservationists, who fear that the bird's rapidly increasing population and the expansion of its territory could upset local native populations, although on the plus side, it has been noted that in areas of high parakeet density natural predators such as hawks and falcons have tended to thrive!

So... look out for these 'exotics' - they will soon be coming to a garden near you!



QUARRY UPDATE

At a recent meeting of the Quarry Liaison Group, members heard that most of the quarry traffic is coming from operations in the Lutterworth and south Leicester areas. The quarry managers noted that less mineral is being found in the Phase 4 site than had been anticipated from test bores earlier in the planning stage, which was resulting in the importation of more material onto site for processing and shipping through the GRS bagging and distribution plant.

The chief focus of operations is on the infill and restoration of the Phase 2 and 3 sites east of the Butt Lane bridle track.

BYGONE BOSWORTH

Images from the Historical Society's Archive Collection

Bosworth villagers hit the headlines 410 years ago, in October 1616, due to a particular malevolence towards local witches. Earlier that year, Leicester alderman, Robert Heyrick noted in letters to his brother that, 'the soone of Mr. Smythe' of Bosworth Hall had been possessed of evil spirits. Nine Bosworth witches were identified and committed for trial at Leicester Assizes. The nine were duly found guilty of bewitching the boy, and were hanged. However, the boy's uncontrollable fits continued and a further six witches were hauled off to Leicester.

By chance, whilst these witches were in gaol, King James happened to be passing through on a Royal Procession of the realm and got wind of the issue. Now, James had been on a personal purge of witchery for a while, and had even written *Daemonologie*, a 'workshop manual' on how to deal with them. However, he was probably getting a bit wary of his own malevolence towards witches, which by this time was getting him a bit of bad press! So, he saw that a bit of leniency towards the next tranche of Bosworth witches might not be a bad move for his standing among his subjects, and ordered the release of five of the women (the sixth having died in gaol)... At any rate, Bosworth womanhood was clearly being sorely depleted by the purges, whilst the boy's fits continued unabated - so thinning out the witches clearly wasn't working!

Interestingly, we don't seem to have any follow-up on the outcome for the poor boy, who presumably was either quack-cured, recovered naturally, died or was given a good thrashing and sent to bed without any supper!
